#### 5. Professor Emeritus

Motion to nominate Dr. John Burka as Professor Emeritus (C. Lacroix, S.Thomas) Carried.

The doors were opened and observers were invited back into the meeting room.

## 6. President's Report

The President presented information related to the 2013-14 budget which would be before the Board of Governors for approval on May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2013. The President's presentation and ensuing discussion included the following:

- The \$9 Million dollar issue with the budget is not a deficit, but a budget shortfall due to stable
  revenues and increasing expenses. The 2013-14 operating budget would in fact be larger than
  last year by \$600 thousand. Revenues from the PEI Government grant did not increase this
  year, and the revenues to the AVC have actually decreased due to a 3% decrease in the grant
  received from Nova Scotia.
- The revenues in the budget are estimates based on anticipated enrollment figures that will be confirmed in late September 2013.
- New revenue generating programs, projects and services, are being considered across the campus.
- Expenses have increased due to inflation, the addition of HST, increased salaries, higher annual pension plan contributions on behalf of the employer as per the collective agreements, rising utility costs, deferred maintenance costs, etc.
- No programs will be adjusted without the advice and consent of the Senate, as indicated in the University Act.

## Questions were raised regarding:

- Offering early retirement incentives. This was not an option as the PEI Government was not
  offering incentives and UPEI would have had to self-finance these, reducing the operating
  budget further.
- Increasing the tuition significantly was also raised as an option, as a proposal to increase the tuition significantly to cover a portion of the shortfall was proposed. It was felt that the ability of students to absorb a large increase would affect enrollment.
- Asking the Board and the PEI Government to allow for a deficit budget. The University Act does not allow for a deficit operating budget.

## **Action items:**

- The Board-Senate Liaison Committee will meet at least once a year.
- The President to bring the issue of classroom size limitations to the Board
- A subcommittee to be struck to look at teaching space recommendations

At 5:00 pm the President requested a motion to extend the meeting until 5:15 pm. Motion to extend the meeting (R. Lemm/R. Gilmour) Carried.

## 7. Other Business

The President noted that despite the difficulties that UPEI is facing, it is important to note that we are approaching Convocation. Families and graduates and the University community are coming together to celebrate.

## 8. Adjournment
